

Bruce Benda watches his D-Region Tomahawk lift off (Photo S. Pantuck)





WEST CALDWELL LAUNCH...It was windy (15-25 mph). It was cold (35-38 degree) The field was small (soccer field) and was marsh-like (it had been warm the past few days).

was only a few days before Christmas afterall.

The launch, was the end of the Model Rocketry class taught as part of West Caldwell's After School Program. During the 10-weeks the students built 2 rockets. One was the Viking and the second either a Cyclone or Sizzler.

A duration competition was held according to rocket type. Viking vs. Viking, Cyclone vs. Cyclone, etc. Winners were awarded memberships in GSSS and the total point winner an NAR membership to boot.

Winners were Doug Squires with the Viking (8.7 seconds). Doug's mother, Vicky was the capable and charming assistant during the semester.

Cyclone winner was Chris Armanto with 17-seconds. The Sizzler contest was the suprise of the day as two flights were over 20-seconds. Not bad for a rocket weighing 4-oz. on a 12-inch chute and only an A8-3 engine. Winner with 23-seconds, and overall top scorer of the day was Eddie Nugent.

The consensus of all attending was favorable. The GSSS members agreed that it was a lot of fun, but what else, when you are doing what you like to do...fly rockets!

NASA announced that at there will be at least six satellites put into orbit using unmanned launch vehicles in 1987. Five from Cape Canaveral Air Force Station and One from Vandenberg AFB, California. The first is scheduled for February 19, 1987.

NASA says flights of the Space Shuttle will begin February 18, 1988 with that of the Discovery. It will have as its payload a TDRS.

The Hubble Space Telescope is scheduled for launch aboard the Atlantis on November 17, 1988. Other scientific payloads are: ASTRO 1 UV Telescope January 19, 1989, Magellan Venus probe April 25, 1989. Galileo Jupiter Probe or Ulysses Mars probe on November 1, 1989. Five flights are planned for 1988. Ten in 1989 and Eleven in 1990.




