///ANSWERS TO OLE ED'S TRIVIA QUIS///



- 1) Vladimir Remek, a captain of the Czechoslovak People's Army flew aboard Soyuz 28 on 03/02/78 to become the first non-American, non-Russian in space. He was burn on 09/26/48.
- 2) Major Robert Henry Lawrence, Jr. was chosen as a member of the Air Force's Manned Orbiting Laboratory in 1967. He was the first U. S. black astronaut candidate selected and held a doctorate in nuclear chemistry from Ohio State University. He died December 8, 1967 when his F-104 jet collided withan XR-70 over Edwards Air Force Bass.
- 3) USAF Major Michael James Adams died near Edwards Air Force Base on November 15, 1967 when the X15 he was piloting crashed after obtaining an altitude of 81 Filometers. The astronaut rating is earned after one achieves over 80 kilometers. He was one of eight X15 pilots to achieve the rating.
